### **Our Heritage @ Risk**

#### **Criteria for Degree of risk and nature of threats, significance and fate**

### Symbol for risk,

- Major loss of fabric or heritage values if no action taken within 6 months. Object will be irreparably damaged or removed from public access
- Major loss of fabric or heritage values if no action taken within 12 months. Object will be irreparably damaged or removed from public access
- Major loss of fabric or heritage values if agreed action not undertaken in a timely manner
- Significant loss of fabric or heritage values if no action taken within 6 months
- Significant loss of fabric or heritage values if agreed action not taken in a timely manner

### Threats

*****	Destruction	Complete loss of heritage value (eg threat of demolition )
****	Deterioration	Heritage value compromised or partially lost (eg. threat of development, inappropriate development, neglect)
***	Devaluation	Heritage value compromised or not valued or partially lost but not to extent of deterioration; eg loss of heritage street character; redundancy such as loss of working port
**	Damage	Heritage values damaged but repairable
*	Disturbance	Heritage values disturbed- (inc disposal)

### Examples of types of threats

- Demolition
- Development pressure
- Government policy change/strategy/ legislation
- Inappropriate development (loss of curtilage, out of scale adjacent development, non-sympathetic re-development)
- Neglect (if severe leading to total loss of fabric/heritage, placed under destruction or fitting into lower level category)
- Redundancy (if a major cause of potential loss of entire heritage value, can be classified as threat of destruction otherwise lower category)
- Loss of habitat
- Disposal
- Damage & degradation (if severe, could fit into destruction, otherwise, damage)

Each of these threats depending on severity could fit into any of the above categories, with the exception of demolition which would immediately be placed under destruction.

**The threat categories relate to degree of loss of heritage.**

- Symbol for threats not determined yet
- Significance
- Criteria for significance is based on Burra Charter

**All nominations must meet significance criteria in one or more of:**

- Aesthetic
- Historic
- Scientific
- Social
- Spiritual

**A statement of significance must accompany the nomination and may include the following:**

- Representativeness
- Authenticity
- Rarity

**Fates**

- \*\*\*\*\* Saved and secure. Solution agreed and implemented
- \*\*\*\* Stable. Solution agreed but not yet fully implemented- not yet saved or secure
- \*\*\* Surviving -Still at risk- in Suspense- unresolved
- \*\* Suffering- situation deteriorating
- \* Stuffed/ shattered or smashed! Lost

**Can be removed from OH@R list**

- Saved but not secured / working towards solution but not completed (eg not yet found adaptive re-use) or saved but no on-going funding and/or CMP
- Threat remains. No change, no decision, no action, no solution
- Still under threat/ getting worse- heritage values suffering from neglect/ compromise/ damage/ deterioration/ devaluation, no solution in sight but not yet lost completely. With action can still be saved
- Lost! Demolished! Heritage values destroyed completely
