

Holy Trinity included in the 10 most at risk Heritage sites

The Holy Trinity Church, North Hobart, has been included in the Australian Council of National Trusts' list of the 10 Most at Risk Heritage Sites in Australia.

Our Heritage@Risk is a new national initiative of the Australian Council of National Trusts. The two tiered program called for nominations from each state and selected those most at risk for consideration nationally.

The risk to the Holy Trinity Church from pressing building conservation needs and impending redundancy highlighted one of the major threats facing an important part of Tasmania's built cultural heritage. The National Trust considers that there is a need for a far more cohesive approach to the management of this most important part of our heritage. It is a responsibility that extends beyond the owners of the building to the community at large as these buildings and the communities that support them contribute so much to the richness of life in Tasmania and our state's identity.

The National Trust looks forward to an effective solution being found for the future use of the Holy Trinity that ensures continued community access to a building that has become part of the everyday life of so many Tasmanians.
