Why is All Saints so important?

All Saints Church sits at the gateway to the village of South Hobart. The architectural style of the church is thirteenth century gothic in the period of transition from Early English to Decorate, a period marked by its simplicity of line.

The foundation stone was laid on 2 December 1858 and the building was opened for worship on 18 August in the year following. It was a condition of the contract that the Rector lead the workman in prayers before the start of each day's work. The side-aisle and chapel were added in 1863 and the vestries in 1895.

The Church's architect was Henry Hunter (1832-1892). He was born in Nottingham, England and was trained in the School of Design there, and in his father's firm of architects.

He emigrated with his parents to Adelaide in 1848, and came to Hobart three years later. After working for a while in the Huon timber trade, and, unsuccessfully at the Bendigo gold diggings, he set up his practice as an architect in Hobart in 1856.

He had a great admiration for the work of Augustus Pugin, the leader of the English gothic revival movement and brought this passion to bear on All Saints and other churches.

All Saints was his first major commission; he went on to become the dominant influence in Tasmanian architecture in the second half of the nineteenth century.

Many of Hobart's finest buildings, public and private were designed by Hunter. The Town Hall, St Mary's Cathedral, the Museum, the Derwent & Tamar building on the corner of Macquarie and Murray Streets are a few. He also supervised the building of St David's Cathedral.

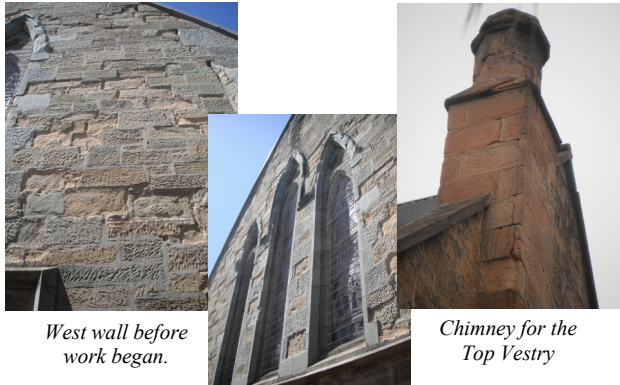
